WEDNESDAY, APRIL 17th Day at the House of Resistance

11 am – 1 pm

Welcome plenary in the barn of the Resistance House (Bure).

1pm-2:30pm : LUNCH

We know it's late for a mealtime, but we promise, it's only on Wednesdays. The rest of the week, it won't be the same, you'll see.

2:30 pm – 3:30pm : legal briefing

It's the first one of the week – don't miss it! All the important information compiled about police surveillance/repression during the week.

- Transmission of the song "Living in Bure" in the **multi-room** (Resistance House, Bure).

• Screening - Greenham Common struggle, led by an eco-feminist collective, in the **multi-room** (Resistance House, Bure).

«Documentary film that we have put together ourselves about the Greenham Common struggle. This fight began in England in the 1980s against the installation of nuclear missiles. After the screening, there will be a time for discussion about the film and the significant role of women in this battle, which took many forms, both fierce and festive, and is very inspiring. »

There will also be songbooks available from the film if anyone is keen on singing into the wee hours. The documentary lasts 1 hour; it's a compilation of archives from that time selected by the collective. The documentary is in English with French subtitles.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 17th End of the day at the Augustine

4pm - 10pm : International Day of Peasant Struggles at l'Augustine (Mandres-en-Barrois).

- 16h-18h :Seed and young plant exchange.
- 18h : Discussion and drinks Who's walking on whose head?

Reflection on movements in the agricultural world. Contests in the agricultural and peasant world in France and Europe. Who are the actors, what are the issues, what are the methods? What commons in the contestation, what commons in agricultural policy? What are the political results of this phase of struggles in winter 2023/2024? After a review of the recent months' protests and the positions of the main unions, we want to share our respective opinions on current agricultural policy. There will be snacks and an info stand from the sowers, as well as a **seed and young plant exchange open from 4 pm**.

• Animals Hate Nuclear - in the **Nuage** (Resistance House, Bure)

The nuclear industry would very much like to portray itself as eco-friendly. It also wants us to believe that it is not harmful to non-human animals (even beneficial). This conference, drawn from a brochure, proposes a non-exhaustive inventory of interactions between non-human animals and nuclear energy. Spoiler alert: Animals suffer greatly at various stages of the nuclear process. But sometimes, they also compromise the security of nuclear sites...

- Training and preparation for the conflicts & aggressions group in the **multi-room** (Resistance House, Bure)
- "How to respond to your Uncle Jančovič supporter" in the **barn** (Resistance House, Bure)

This is a participatory and interactive workshop in the form of forum theater, aimed at addressing the numerous remarks that anyone campaigning against nuclear power has heard at least once (e.g., "but nuclear power is a decarbonized energy source, it will be valuable for us to address climate change" or "but if France exits nuclear power, it will end up like Germany and return to coal"). Through this workshop, we hope to provide practical tools to participants to know how to refute such fallacious arguments that are frequently heard, and to leave with a more comprehensive understanding of how the nuclear industry operates.

- 10am-12pm : Anti-nuclear satire songwriting workshops
- 2pm 4:30pm : Transcription on the computer via software to create a fantastic karaoke "Hell's Anti-nuclear Autinuk" to be spread throughout France! We can continue writing songs in the afternoon or start transcribing in the morning, really it doesn't matter. Catch-up workshop on Saturday at the same time as artivism. You can also write satire songs in your spare time, of course.

High Activity Long Life (HA-VL) ... Philippe Bouvet is a communicator: his job is to make you dream with a giant nuclear waste bin. And he does his job well. Even when everything goes awry and a supernatural delivery woman imposes the radioactive waste itself on stage, Philippe pushes his limits and invents the absurd to save the day, maintain appearances, and convince you ... no matter the cost.

Blockade and sabotage of rail traffic in the context of the anti-nuclear movement resistance to nuclear transports has become for many the symbol of the German antinuclear movement in its last active phase (1990-2011). The conference will attempt to give a brief overview of the historical evolution as well as the practices implemented. An abbreviated and illustrated version of the exhibition of the same name, which was visible since 2019 at the former Luméville station and which unfortunately is no longer in a particularly presentable state.

• Walk along the railway track: departure from the **gare**.

An informative excursion that will address the construction project of the Castor line for CIGEO. In the second part, we want to specifically focus on this regional construction project (status of preparatory work, timeline planning, line construction, etc.). The Belgian state has announced a burial project, it's very vague but it's like the beginnings of CIGEO in the 1980s. Context + group discussions on the strategies that have worked in France, which ones to avoid, and their potential application in Belgium.

• Decolonize Feminism - in the **multi-room** (Resistance House)

Is anti-racism a vague and distant notion for you? Are you concerned about these issues and haven't had the opportunity to express yourself on the subject? Or are you simply interested in the topic? Come join our workshop during the spring week! This awareness-raising workshop aims to deconstruct biases and racist prejudices and to train in anti-racism through important concepts for us. The program includes a workshop structured around interactive games and popular education. We're looking forward to seeing you there!

Starting at l'Affranchie at 2:00 PM, we'll leave together at 1:25 PM on foot from the Resistance House. People will be available to listen if needed.

In the same way that ecofeminish established a link between violence towards minorities and the planet, the rape and the destruction of ecosystems, I propose to think about a link between nuclear power and incest.

Both nuclear power and incest are so pervasive, massive, and dangerous that they lead to powerlessness and denial. The goal is to create a space for writing and speaking. A first step (which could continue over time) to open up new angles of analysis and attack against these two oppressions.

Being a racialized person in the countryside and in places of struggle (life, survival, wellbeing, and collective organization).

This workshop, in chosen mixed-race spaces for people experiencing racism, aims to be a discussion about minority experiences in the countryside and in places of struggle in rural areas. The idea is to exchange experiences in spaces where the majority is white and to imagine paths for collective organization. This workshop is also open to racialized individuals who do not live in the countryside or in places of struggle but are interested in this theme.

• The Fight Against the High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC): Sabotage of Power Lines as a Political Action Field

Forty years ago, EDF (Électricité de France) said, "If nuclear power plants can be protected by barbed wire and possibly riot police, it is not the case for [HVDC] pylons." What is the situation today? Drawing from the history of the fight against the Cotentin-Maine HVDC line in La Manche and other stories gathered here and there, the idea of this workshop is to reflect on what the implications might be in terms of strategy and continuity of the struggle. First module: presentation and debate based on demands, press articles, and other texts on the subject.

1:30pm-3:30pm

• Anti-HVDC Struggle Walk and Presentation: 2nd Module - Walk on the Same Theme

A pedagogical, informative, and entertaining journey. Notes: Walk not accessible; in case of adverse conditions (weather, repression situation), a replacement activity on the same theme will take place at the train station.

4pm - 6pm

• Discussion of the practices and offensive tactics of the anti-Cigeo struggles. Retrospective and perspectives. What actions have existed in the past and what echoes today for the current struggle?

Since the beginning of the ANDRA installation in the south of the Meuse, there has been resistance against the major nuclear project to bury radioactive waste called Cigéo. For more than 25 years, demonstrations have been organized, the local population is informed of the dangers, legal trials are conducted by organizations. Alongside this much-needed work of activists, direct actions and acts of sabotage are regularly carried out by autonomous groups in the region and beyond against this project. There are many forms of resistance: tags, brochures, illegal posters, decommissioning of installations, material damage to infrastructure, etc. If there is a fairly widespread "secret joy" within the movement... Sometimes even an open sympathy for these acts, it is rare to seriously debate this militant practice involving more risks. We want to take a closer look at some of these often nocturnal activities, from the point of view of their concrete practice, but also from the point of view of the strategies that underlie them (insofar as they are disseminated with press releases by the authors). We hope with this workshop, to contribute modestly to giving a voice to a part of this movement which, for obvious reasons, cannot express itself publicly, and in its name.

Within the network, we have two types of missions:

* provide "psycho-emotional first aid" in contexts of high conflict (especially during actions), especially in the face of repression

* Promote a culture of care in an activist environment through training and awarenessraising sessions on issues of militant psycho-emotional distress and the consequences that can result from it in the short and long term.

We are activists, we are not mental health professionals. As some of them are part of the legal team or medic team, of the canteen, we have done prevention and psychological and emotional support

10am-12pm : Understanding reactions to a high-stress situation – 12 people max

1:30pm-3:30pm : Sharing of psycho-emotional tools – The Wheel of Resilience – 25 people max

This review provides an overview of the consequences of uranium extractivism. Nearly 70% of these mines are located on the land of Aboriginal peoples; This is also the story of the resistance of these peoples.

We will explore articles that analyze from a feminist point of view certain moments of antinuclear struggles and the social reality of nuclear power. The discussions that will result from these readings will aim to inspire current mobilizations through our collective reflections.

• History of Chooz's Struggle – at **la gare**

Screening-discussion with "les Zarchives Charlotte". These are raw documents from rushes that address the genesis of the movement against the Chooz nuclear power plant in the face of the propaganda of the authorities and the nucleocrats. In addition to this workshop; excerpts from radio shows ("ça costera cher de nous foutre en l'air", Radio Primitiveau, etc.) and excerpts from films and images ("Les nuits câlines", "Les clochards de chooz").

• Videoconferencing: fight against the burial of nuclear waste in Canada / Turtle Island – in **multi** room (Maison de Résistance, Bure)

Videoconferencing with a person fighting against a project equivalent to Cigeo in Canada to talk about the processes put in place there to impose the project. Translations of documents of struggles or arguments against nuclear waste burial projects will also be available.

• Rights in Police Custody Workshop, Level 2 – in the **Nuage** (House of Resistance)

To deepen our rights in police custody, to reflect on different strategies related to the denial of identity, to better understand police repression.

Initially, it was the book "Women Against Missiles", but in reality the subject is emotions.

10 am – 12 pm : Reading and surveying Chapter II: "An Intimate Nightmare" and discussing what it causes, evokes for us. With the idea of detaching oneself from the binary side of the basic approach.

2pm-4pm : Collective writing around our dreams – nightmares – emotions of queers against nuk

The overall idea of this workshop is to take time to talk about our emotions. That's why we decided to spend a whole day at La Grosse Poule Magique (the big magic hen in french) together. The book is a medium to help us expel our emotions and talk about our nightmarish intimacies around this world and the helplessness, anger, fear, rage and determination that nuclear power provokes. We will make small groups so that we can all talk and express ourselves.

Beginning in the 1970s, anarchist and libertarian groups began to intervene with a revolutionary social perspective in the anti-nuclear movement, which until then had been mainly marked by peace activists, civil rights activists, and Christian humanists. What analyses and hopes were linked to this approach and to what extent did they come true? Is the concept still valid today as a point of reference for radical environmental movements, despite a fundamentally different starting point? And if so, what are the strategic steps for us?

• Anti-nuclear coordination time – in the **barn** (house of resistance)

Talking about the April 27 demonstration, preparing banners, brainstorming, what to do on October 12 as an anti-nuc' action

An immortal infusion is a kind of talking circle around death and mourning. It lasts about 3 hours.

• 1:30pm-4pm : Extractivism Workshop – in **multi** (Resistance House, Bure)

The principle is to first explain how nuclear power works in broad terms, and therefore why it consumes radioactive metal, and therefore why the nuclear industry is intimately dependent on the mining industry. Then we do a participatory workshop in groups to understand what the impact of an average conventional mine (gold, potassium and coal) is in terms of waste and energy consumption.

 Screening-Discussion: Further Investigation on Nuclear Waste (October 2023) – In Nuage (House of Resistance)

It deals with the issue of waste: a bit CIGEO, the Hague, the trafficking of French waste in Russia, Tricastin, nuclear propaganda and bought journalists, cancers following military tests in Polynesia. The screening can be followed by a discussion if desired. The film is in French, with no subtitles.
